

# Tent Units at Camp Ken-Jockey

Camp Ken-Jockey offers up to four tent units located throughout the camp. An additional primitive tent camping area is located in the eastern part of camp.



## Tent Unit Locations and Settings

Gypsy and Dipper Hill are located near the heart of main camp, Ashgrove is located near the pool house, and Woodcrest is located directly behind Trumbull Lodge. All tent units are located in wooded areas and are near trails, the Big Darby Creek, and Becky's Pond.

## Site Features and Program Possibilities

On this 220-acre wooded site, there is enough space for activities with other troops also using the site. The Big Darby Creek, a state and national scenic river, is on the western border of camp. Bring your own poles and bait to fish in Becky's Pond. Seasonal canoeing and archery (requires advance registration) also are available. The Elam Environmental Center is located nearby and offers staff-led programs for all ages. Other activities could include nature study, cooking, campfires, flag ceremonies, hiking, crafts, Girl Scout's Own, and mapping.

## Tent Unit Specifications

Availability:	Mid-April through mid-October, except during day camp. Availability may vary with season.
Capacity:	Ashgrove: up to 28 people may stay overnight Gypsy, Dipper Hill, and Woodcrest: 20 each
Construction:	Raised wood platform with canvas tent. Four beds with mattresses in each tent.
Shelter:	Wood picnic shelter, some with fireplace
Furniture:	Picnic tables in shelter
Lighting:	Two Little Wizard kerosene lanterns
Refrigeration:	Available in Dining Hall for all units except Ashgrove and Woodcrest, which share one of two refrigerators in Trumbull Lodge.
Bathroom:	Latrine in each unit, showers at pool house
Water:	Outdoor hand pumps or faucets, well water
Firewood:	Free wood is always available in the forest
